Distress Warrants Now Being Issued

Distress warrants are now being issued by the county treasurer's office for all unpaid 1957 and back personal taxes, and must be turned over to the sheriff on or before October 1, according to Holt County Treasurer J. E. Hancock. Payments made before October 1 will avoid additional expense. The advertising list for delinquent 1957 taxes must be published for three weeks beginning October 9. Payment must be received before noon on October 4 to be stricken from the advertising list. Payment made after October 4 will be in the list of publication. The cost of advertising is 50 cents each description. To avoid this additional expense, payment must be made before noon October 4. Hancock explained. There are only 35 days left for taxpayers to renew their drivers licenses for another year. All drivers between the ages of 16 to 20 must renew their licenses before close of business October 31 to avoid taking another test for a new license. These are the licenses with a letter C ahead of the county prefix 36. The ones with letter K will expire September 1, 1959.

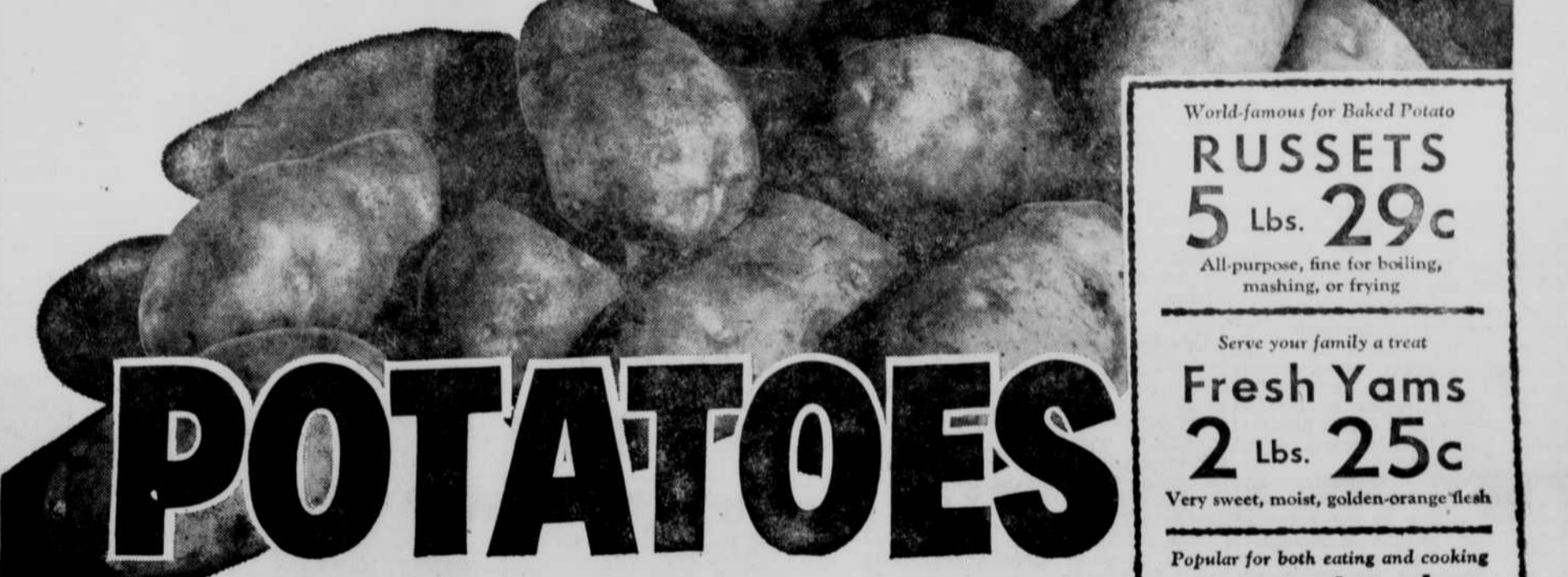
