

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

In addition to his salary, each member shall receive an amount equal to his actual expenses in traveling by the most usual route once to and returning from each regular or special session of the Legislature. Members of the Legislature shall receive no pay nor perquisites other than said salary and expenses, and employees of the Legislature shall receive no com-pensation other than their salary or per diem.'

"Sec. 6. Notwithstand-

ing any other provision in the Constitution, the Legislature may authorize any incorporated city or village, including cities operating under home rule charters, to acquire, own, and lease real and personal property to manufacturing, industrial, and commercial enterprises and to issue revenue bonds for the purpose of defraying the cost of acquiring such property by construction, purchase, or otherwise. The principal of and interest on any bonds issued may be secured by a pledge of the lease and the revenues therefrom and by mortgage upon such property and shall be payable solely out of the revenues derived from the leasing of such property. No city or village shall have the power to operate any such property as a business or in any manner except as the lessor thereof."
