Room Mothers Are Chosen by P-TA

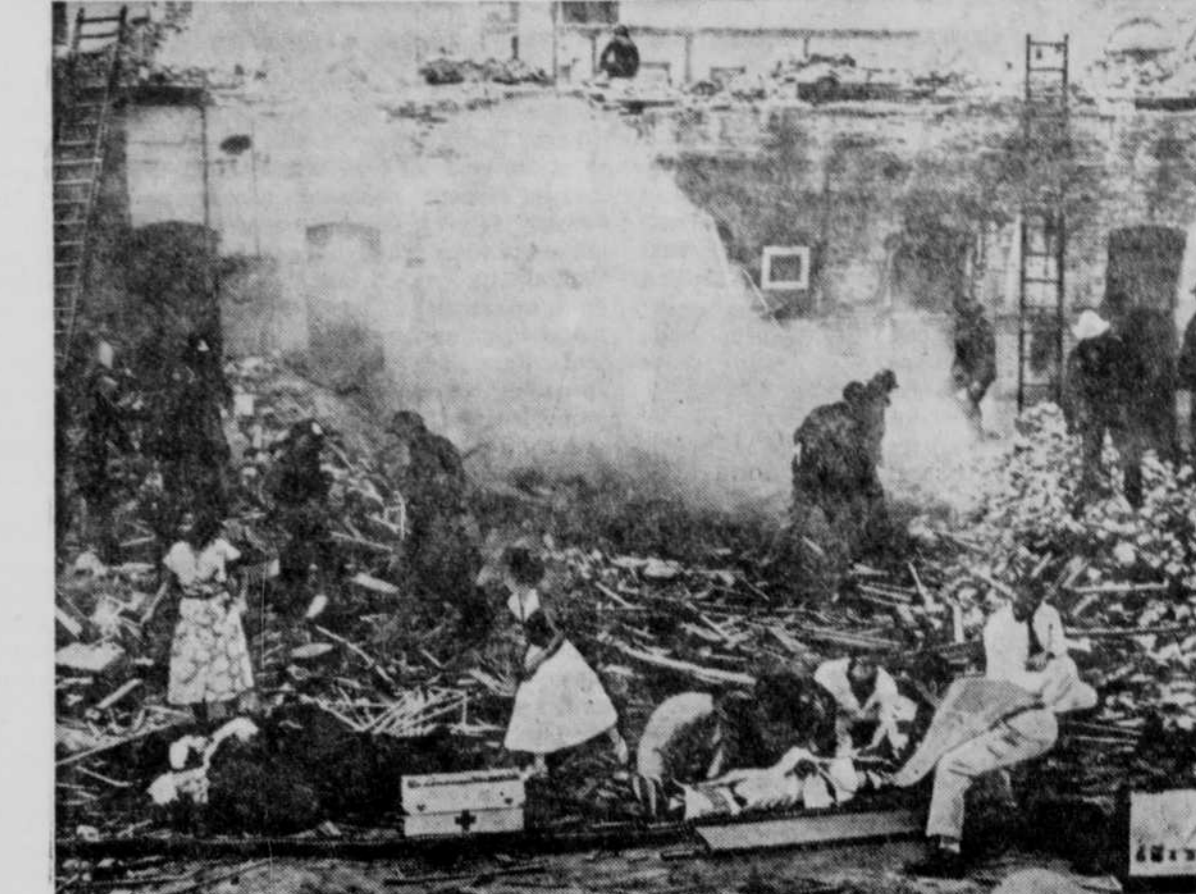
