Looks like a real good sale today (Thursday). There'll be 500-600 head including 300-400 calves including 50 head of choice steer calves from mAtkinson; 30 head of black steers from south of O'Neill; 80 head of Shorthorn-Angus cross calves, good-to-choice for quality.
