½ cup brown sugar, firmly Cream together butter and sugars until light and fluffy. Beat in vanil-la and egg yolks. Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with but-

ermilk; mix until smooth. Gradually beat ½ cup brown sugar into egg whites; continue beating until mixture is stiff and glossy. Fold into batter. Pour into 2 greased and floured 9-inch cake minutes. Cool on cake rack 10 minutes. Remove from pans and cool. Frost with a seven minute frosting.
