Mrs. Josephine Butterfield was the eldest and Alan Bright the youngest in attendance.

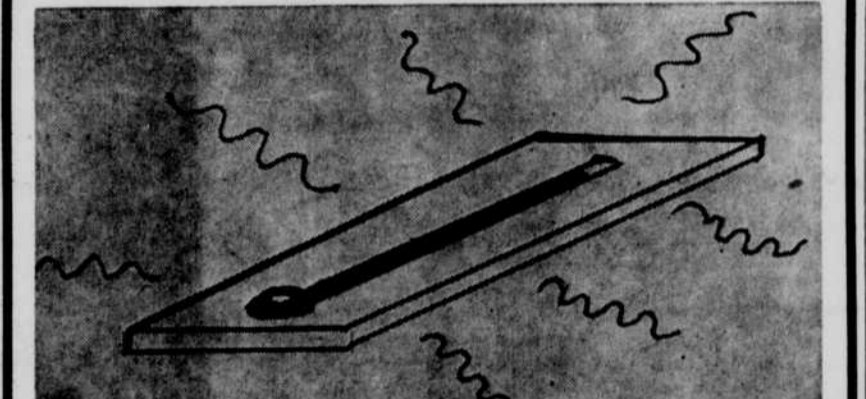
Since the reunion in 1958 there has been 9 births, one death and 2 marriages in the family.

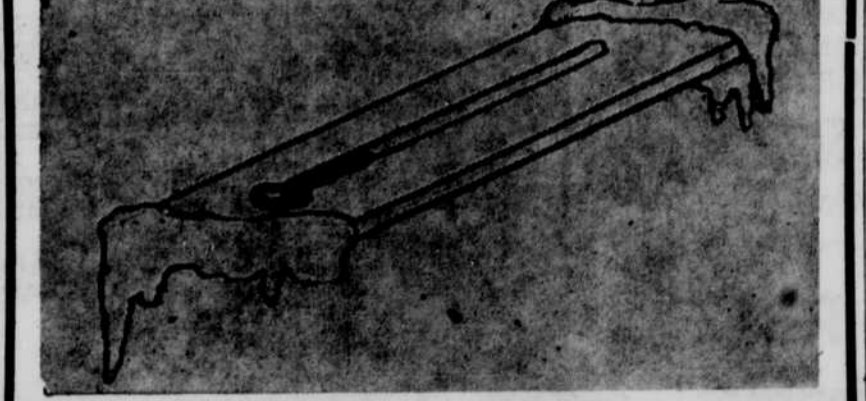
The 1960 reunion will be held at the park in Neligh Sunday, July 24, the fourth Sunday of the month.
