All Drivers Licenses will Expire on September 1, 1959. There will be a 60 day renewal period. Applicants failing o renew within the 60 days will be required to make application to the examiners and pass the test before getting a new license. The fee will be \$2.00 for 2 years for persons 20 years old and

older, \$1.50 for persons 16 to 19 inclusive for 1 year. The old license must be brought or sent in with the correct fee before a renewal can be issued. A self addressed stamped envelope should be sent along for mailing out the renewal. No renewals can be issued before September 1st. Be sure your old license is signed before presenting.

# TAX NOTICE

Distress warrants must be issued on all unpaid delinquent personal taxes and turned over to the Sheriff on or before October 1st. After distress warrants have been turned over to the Sheriff, the tax must be paid to the Sheriff.

All unpaid delinquent 1958 Real Estate taxes not paid by noon on October 10 must be advertised in the County papers as designated by the County Board, for three weeks. The charge of advertising is charged against the property.
