BE IT ORDAINED by the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Ewing, Nebraska:

Section 1: That no person shall construct, erect, any privy, outhouse, cesspool or septic tank for the reception of sewage or waste from a drain from any building, or otherwise, in the Village of Ewing, when the city sewer system is available to the premises on which said privy, cesspool, outhouse, or septic tank is located. The city sewer system shall be considered available for the purposes of this section when said system abuts the premises on which said privy, outhouse, cesspool or septic tank is located or serves, or when connection can be had to said city sewer system by the running of pipes or drains from said premises through public streets and alleys a distance of not more than 300 feet from any point on the boundary line of the premises to be served.

Section 2: Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be ordered to pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars, and each day that said violation continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offense and violation of this ord-

Section 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as required by law. Passed and approved this 4th day of August 1959.
