NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Sealed proposals endorsed with the title of the work and the bidder's name will be received in the office of the City Clerk of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, until 7 p.m., on the 6th day of October, 1959, for the furnishing of all labor, materials, use of contractor's equipment and plant and for all else necessary to properly construct all of the improvements within Sewer District No. 1 of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska.

At which hour, or as soon as possible thereafter, the Mayor and the City Council of O'Neill, Nebraska, will proceed to open in the presence of all bidders and consider the bids received for the furnishing of said labor, materials, and equipment necessary for the proper construction of the aforesaid improvements.

The Engineer's estimate of the cost of construction is \$20,125.00. All work called for in the plans and specifications shall be furnished in strict accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by Kirkham, Michael and Associates, Special Engineers of Omaha, Nebraska, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk of O'Neill, Nebraska.

Bids will be received only upon the proposal forms furnished by the City, through its Special Engineers, Kirkham, Michael and Associates, of Omaha, Nebraska. Each bid must be accompanied by a Synopsis of Experience Record illustrating experience in construction of work of this type or of a similar nature.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check on a bank whose deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation in the amount of five percent (5%) of the total bid price, and must be payable without condition to the Treasurer of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, as evidence of good faith of the bidder, and as agreed liquidated damages to the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, in case the bidder whose proposal is accepted by the Mayor and City Council fails to enter into contract within ten (10) days from the Notice of the Award and furnish acceptable bond to complete the work and pay for all labor and materials used, said bond to be in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the total price.

Each contractor bidding upon the work described in this Notice, at the same time as the filing of the bid shall file with the Mayor or City Council of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, a statement that he is complying with and will continue to comply with fair labor standards as defined in Section 73-104 R. S., Nebraska, 1943, in the pursuit of his business and execution of the contract on which he is bidding, and there shall be written into the contract for the construction of the work referred to herein a provision that in the execution of such contract fair labor standards as so defined shall be maintained.

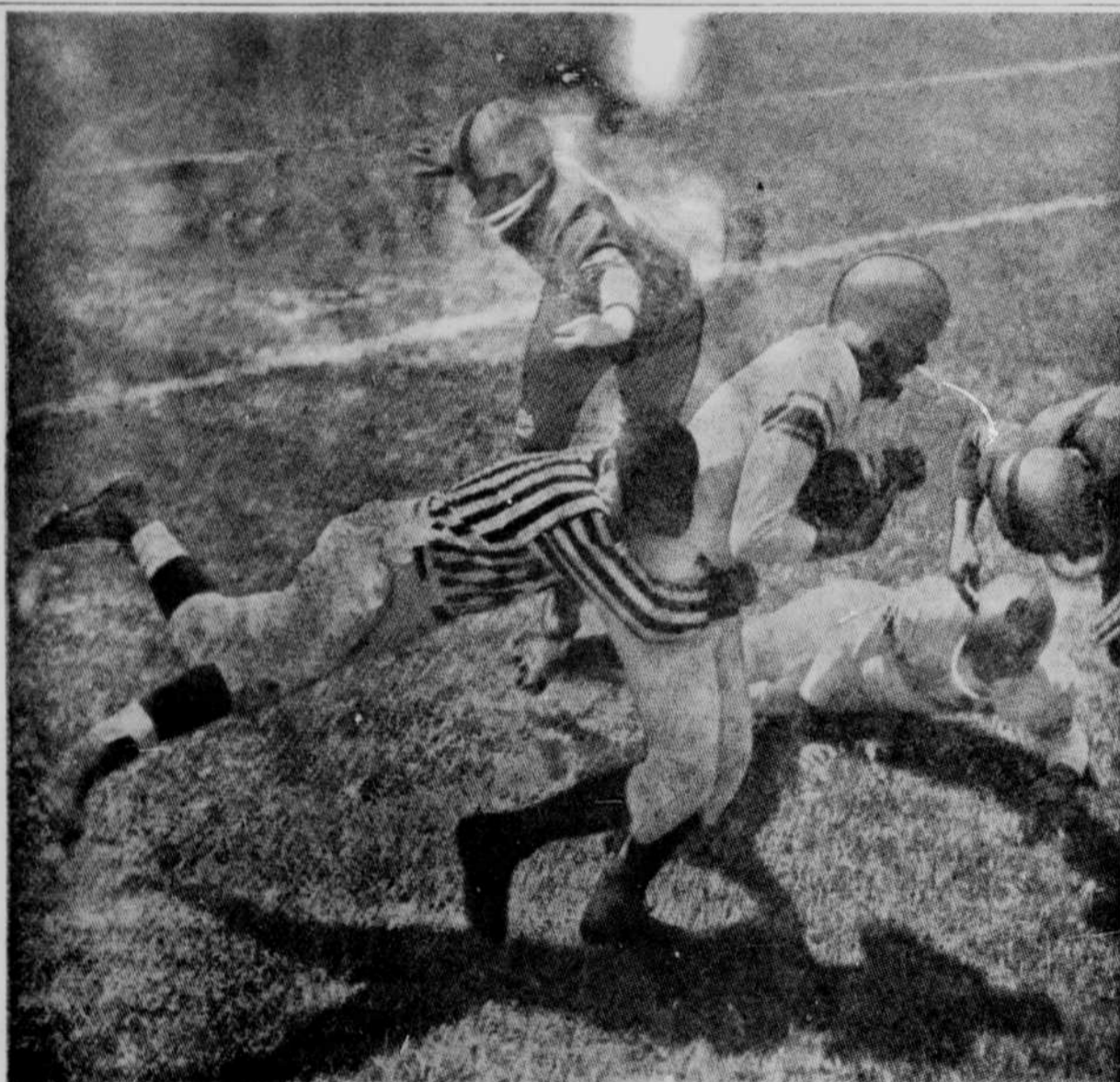
