

Eagles Win Tournament Beat Ainsworth by One

O'Neill High Eagles continued its one-point mastery over North-Central conference teams Friday downing Ainsworth for the second time this season, 62-61, and won the conference tournament at Ainsworth.

The Eagles gained the finals by beating Valentine by one-point in the closing seconds. O'Neill led most of the way in Friday night's game with Ainsworth and sported a 5-point margin at halftime. At the close of the first quarter, the game was tied at 17 all. The Eagles then poured in 20 points during the second quarter to lead at halftime, 37-32.

A cold third quarter enabled Ainsworth to cut the lead to one point, 46-45, but O'Neill matched Ainsworth's fourth quarter total of 16 points to take the win.

Bob Eby continued his scoring habits by dumping 28 points in the final game. Bob Micheel had 20 points for Ainsworth.

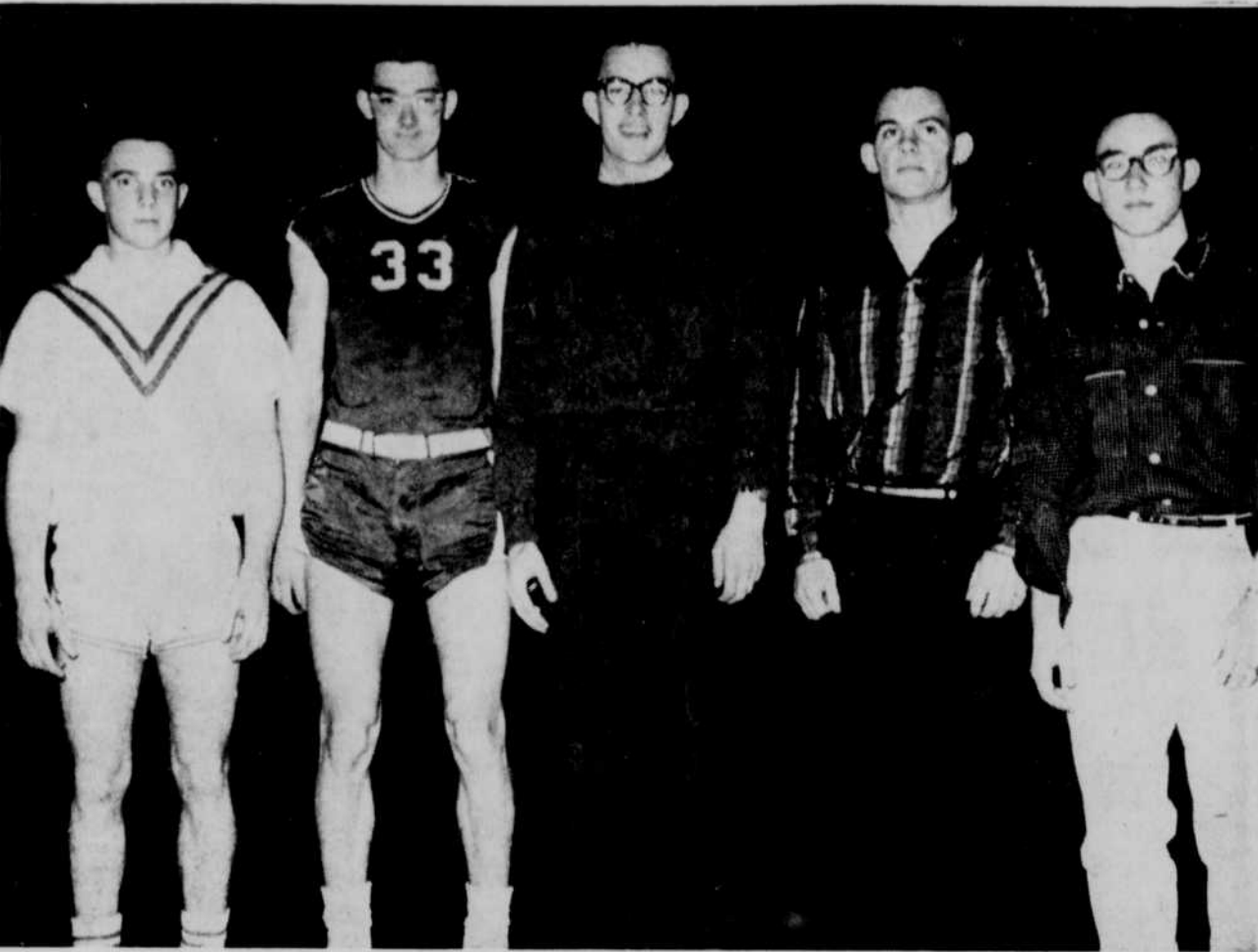
