
More capital has been poured into livestock production in the past five years. These glass-lined, airtight storage units will each hold more than 8,000 bushels of high moisture grain. With larger acreages being cropped, farmers have invested more in feed and grain handling facilities. Auger feeding setups such as this are fast becoming commonplace.







"Deplorable," comments the urbanite out for a Sunday afternoon drive. In truth, abandoned sub-standard farmsteads are monuments to progress. This farmstead is no longer needed. The farmland it once served has been joined with another unit to provide more efficient size and more adequate incomes to its owners.

Further changes will evolve in the average farm in the next several years. Among other things there'll be more large cattle feeding setups in the Midwest similar to this one now in operation in Illinois. These larger lots will all be on a continuous feeding program. USDA says the two million farms that now produce 90% of the farm products will shrink further in number and become larger in size.


Family farming has been strengthened by consolidation of smaller uneconomic farms into larger units that can provide sufficient income for such father and son teams as the one shown. One of the most common problems in father and son farming arrangements results when income on one farm is too small for two families. Larger units are often the answer.
