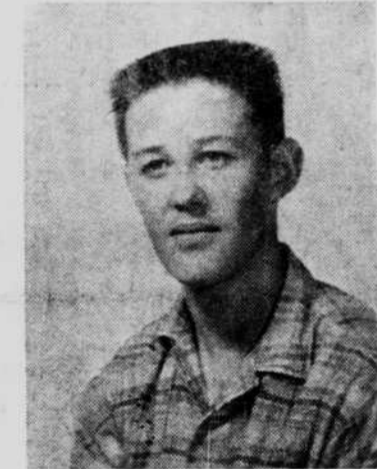


they retired and moved to O'Neill where they had since made their home.

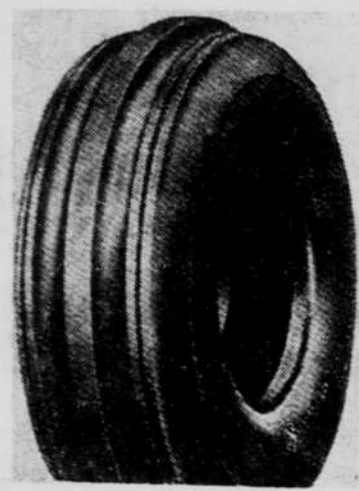
