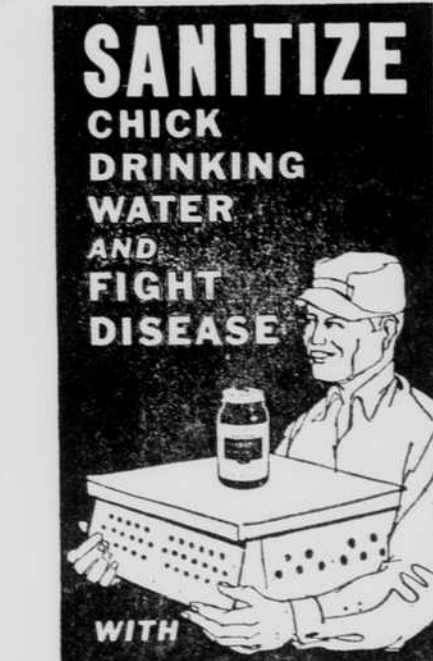

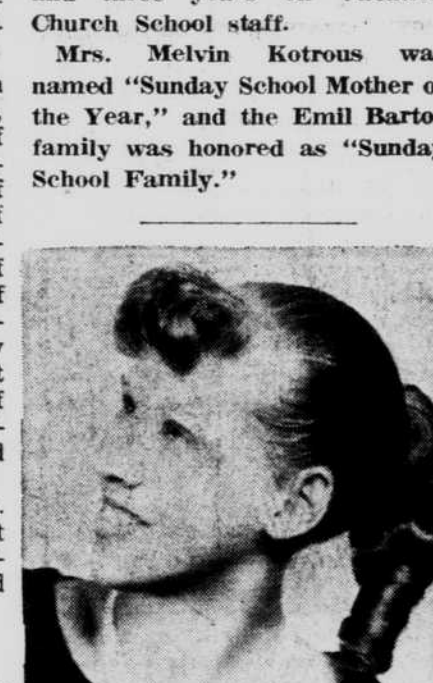

Mrs. Melvin Krotous was named "Sunday School Mother of the Year," and the Emil Borthos family was honored as "Sunday School Family."

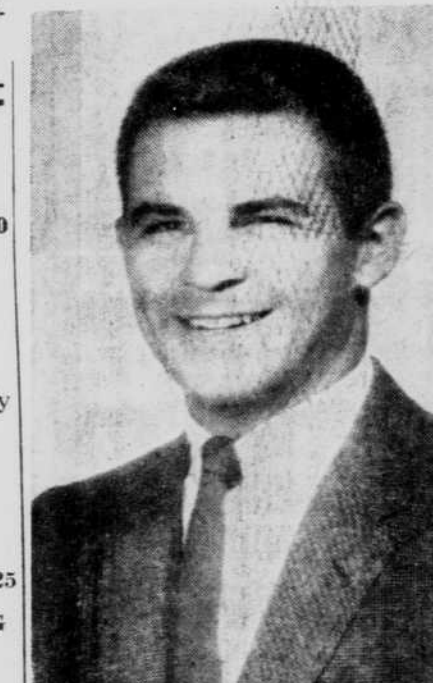
