Doniphan Farm Family Finds Heating Answer for Older Home

Flameless electric heat works just as well in older homes. For this, you have the words of Mr. and Mrs. Charles X. Miller who live in a 80-year-old frame home eight miles from Doniphan.

"We find electric heat is better from a humidity standpoint," the Millers reported. Mrs. Miller likes the way her fresh cut flowers stay lovelier longer with radiant electric heat. "Must be good for people, too," said Mr. Miller. "I know we both feel better and have fewer colds." That's because there are no drafts with electric heat.

The Millers installed electric heat baseboards and panels in their home in October, 1959. Installation consists of blown rock wool, 4 inches in walls, 6 inches in ceiling and 2 inches under the floor. Total square footage: 1,744. Total heating bill (January 10, 1960 to January 10, 1961): \$179.
