Agent for a copy of the bulletin 'Sour Cream' Sour Cream heightens the taste

of the most ordinary foods. It

has a sharp flavor, smooth texture and butterfat found in sweet cream. The cream is an excellent source of vitamin A and the fat is readily and easily digested.

How to Use Sour Cream Where it is not to be cooked, SOUR CREAM can be made stiffer by whipping. Care must be taken not to overwhip the cream, or it will churn and turn to buter. For the same reason, and to hasten whipping, the cream must

be kept cold while being whipped. Because one cup of heavy sour cream contains part fat, (about six tablespoons) it can be used to replace part or all of the fat called for in recipes for pancakes, biscuits, cakes, etc., as well as to replace the milk. In batters requiring a high percent of liquid the heavy sour cream may contain more fat than the amount called for in the original recipe,

and a richer product will result. In baked products, soda may be used as all or part of the leavening agent in the proporation of 1/2 teaspoon of soda to 1 cup of sour cream. This sour cream can be used in the same way as

rich sour milk. The following recipes have been popular with guests at our house. Mary Carey of the Dairy Council in Lincoln provided the follow-

ing coffee cake recipe. Sour Cream Coffee Cake

1½ cup butter 1 cup granulated sugar

2 eggs cups sifted all-purpose flour tsp. baking powder ½ tsp. salt

½ pint dairy sour cream 1 tsp. vanilla Topping cup brown sugar, firmly packed

1/4 cup white sugar

1 tsp. cinnamon 1 cup pecans, finely chopped Preheat oven to 325°F. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well, Sift dry ingredients togeher. Add to creamed mixture alternately with sour cream, beginning and ending with flour. Stir in vanilla. Pour half of batter into buttered 9x9inch baking pan, cover with half of nut topping, pour remaining batter over filling and top with rest of nut mixture. Bake approxi-


