bride.

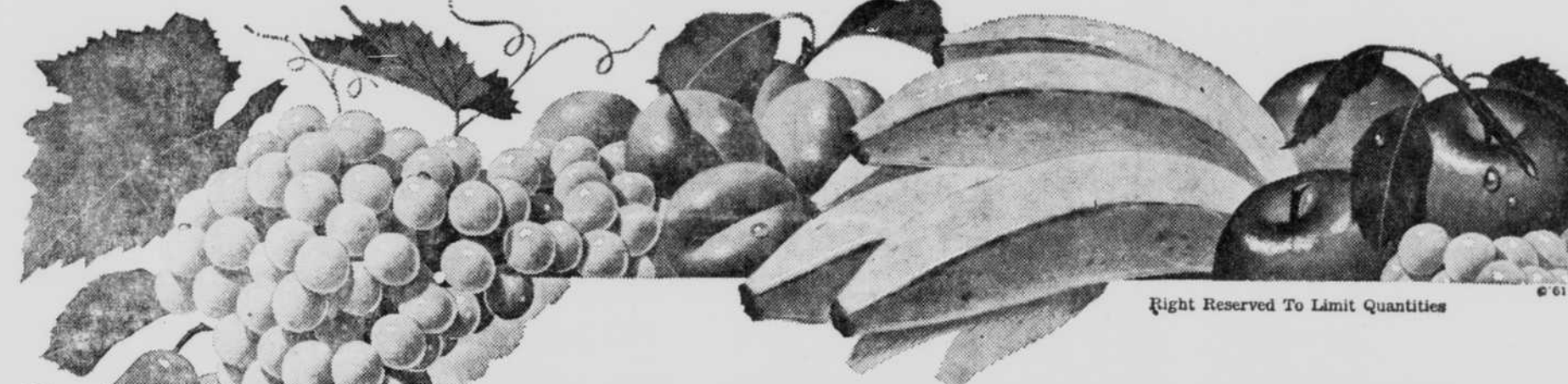

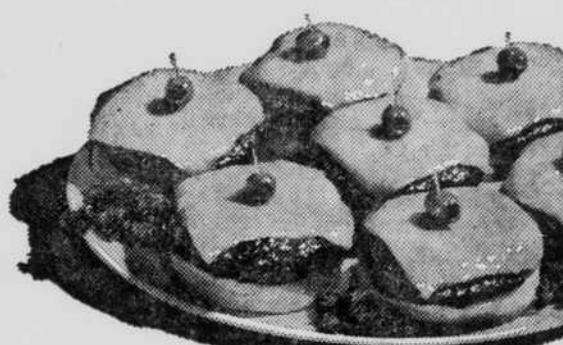

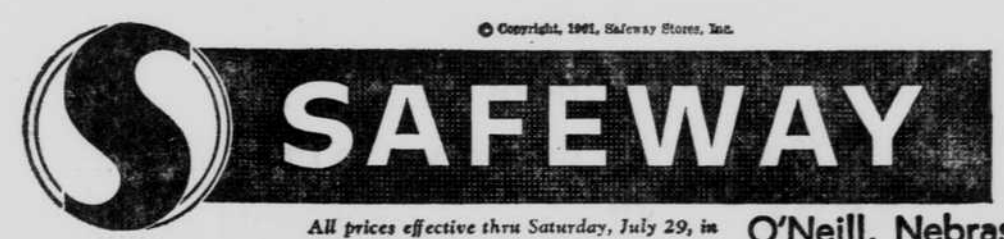
