2. All entries in this class will clear through the County Agent's office. All entries shall be made through the local club leader or fair superintendents.

3. Exhibits must represent the exhibitor's own work accomplished since the last fair.

4. 4-H exhibits may not be shown in open class.

5. Only articles mentioned in the premium list will be eligible to receive premiums.

6. No premium money will be paid by the management until project records are up to date at fair time and approved by the 4-H club leader.

7. In case of only one entry, prize shall be awarded on quality.

8. All possible diligence and care will be used to prevent loss or injury to exhibits, but the management of the fair will in no way be responsible should loss or injury occur. Each club is responsible for entering and removing exhibits.

Entry Rules

4-H livestock may be entered any time before and up to 6 p.m. Entry Day. Members are urged to enter by mail. Please send entries to HENRY WOOD, superintendent of livestock, Ewing, Nebraska five days prior to entry day.

All Hereford and Angus Steers must be weighed on fair grounds for classification purposes. The scales will be furnished by Fair Board.

Send approximate weight of stocker feeder calves when making entries.

All livestock to be in place and ready for judging Judging Day by 9 a.m.

Agricultural, home economics and all other 4-H exhibit entries to be entered and in place by 6 p.m. Entry Day. Judging of exhibits will be on Judging Day.

Judging of individual and team demonstrations, home economics judging contests to take place on Demonstration Day.

Livestock judging to be Judging Day except saddle horses which will be the morning of the last day, and need not be on grounds before the last day.

Lot I

Individual and Team Demonstrations

A team demonstration shall consist of two members of the same standard boy's or girls' 4-H club in which the record of each member is up-to-date at fair time. Individual demonstrations may be given by any individual in his own project. Team demonstrations should not be more than 30 minutes and individual demonstrations more than 20 minutes in length. Judges' questions only will be scored in competitive demonstrations. Home economics and agricultural demonstrations will start at 9 a.m. on Demonstration Day. Premiums are as follows:
