Motion by Heermann, seconded by Gleeson, that the request of Mr. William Murray to move his Off sale Beer and Liquor License from the present location to the following location of Lot 1, Block 16, Original Town of O'Neill, be granted. A roll call vote being taken on the above motion with the following results. Aye Gleeson, Reynolds, Carroll, McIntosh, Janousek and Heermann. Nay none.
Motion by Gleeson, seconded by Carroll, that the Council grant John S. Havelka a raise of \$25.00 per month starting with the first of July, 1961. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE 337-A
Council Gleeson introduced the following Ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY TO RAISE FUNDS BY TAXATION OF PROPERTY SITUATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING THE FIRST TUESDAY IN MAY 1961, AND ENDING THE FIRST TUESDAY IN MAY 1962.
Said Ordinance was fully and distinctly read, and on motion duly made, seconded and adopted, it was designated as Ordinance No. 337-A and the title thereof was approved.
Councilman Carroll, moved that the statutory rule requiring Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three different days be dispensed with, which motion was seconded by Councilman Heermann, and the Yeas and Nays being called on the passage of a said motion the following Councilmen voted Yea; Gleeson, Reynolds, Carroll, McIntosh,

Janousek and Heermann. Nay none. The motion having been concurred in by three-fourths of the Council was declared passed and adopted, and said statutory rule suspended.
Thereupon said Ordinance No. 337-A was read by its title a second time and was then read at large and put upon final passage. The Mayor stated that the question is: "Shall Ordinance No. 337-A be passed and adopted?" The Yeas and Nays were called and the following Councilmen voted Yea; Gleeson, Reynolds, Carroll, McIntosh, Janousek and Heermann. Nay none.
The passage and adoption of said Ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members elected to the Council was by the Mayor declared passed and adopted and the Mayor in the presence of the Council signed and approved said Ordinance and the Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed his signature thereto.
The following is a true, correct and complete copy of said ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 337-A
An Ordinance providing for a levy to raise funds by taxation of property situated within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, for the fiscal year beginning the first Tuesday in May 1961 and ending the first Tuesday in May 1962.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBR. Section 1. That the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, make the following levy for taxation for the fiscal year beginning the first Tuesday in May 1961, on the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska.
For General purposes, 3.40 mills on the dollar.
For Street lighting, 1.10 mills on the dollar.
For Fire Department maintenance, .50 mills on the dollar.
For Maintenance of Streets and Alleys, 3.00 mills on the dollar.
For Airport Maintenance, 1.00 Mills on the dollar.
For Park Maintenance, .50 mills on the dollar.
For Municipal Advertising, 20 mills on the dollar.
For Water Bond Sinking Fund, 1.00 Mills on the dollar.
For Park Improvements Bonds, 1.00 Mills on the dollar.
For Intersection Bonds, 2.00 Mills on the dollar.
For Paving District No. 16 Bonds, .70 mills on the dollar.
For Storm Sewer Bonds, .60 Mills on the dollar.
Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after passage and publication as provided by Law.
