turned to O'Neill. Lloyd Ray Vequist was born August 16, 1913 to Henry and Bertha Vequist at O'Neill. During World War II he served as a pilot in the U. S. Air Corps. In 1945 he was married to Mary J. Vanderbeek, Stuart. Mr. Vequist served as a Purdue Aeronautics corporation pilot at Purdue university. He was a member of the Veterans of World War II USAF; Omaha Elks Lodge 1817; Omaha American Legion; Moose Chapter 1529 and VFW 1154, both of Lafayette.


