reasons.) The Polaris streaked 1,500 miles down the Atlantic Missile Range to successfully hit its target, marking a significant milestone in the development of the nation's retaliatory capabilities.

The Ethan Allen, the world's largest submarine, is undergoing missile-firing tests at Cape Canaveral.
