## Servicemen's Notes . . .

Dennis R. Angel, electronics technician second class, USN, son of Mrs. Pat Langan, Spencer, while serving aboard the nuclear-powered submarine USS Ethan Allen, participating in the firing of a Polaris A-2 missile, October 23, at Cape Canaveral, Fla. (Story delayed for security reasons.)

The Polaris streaked 1,500 miles down the Atlantic Missile Range to successfully hit its target, marking a significant milestone in the development of the nation's retaliatory capabilities.

The Ethan Allen, the world's largest submarine, is undergoing missile-firing tests at Cape Canaveral.

Robert R. Remter, hospital corpsman second class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. Remter, Spencer, is serving aboard the guided missile light cruiser USS Topeka, a unit of the First Fleet which took part in Exercise Black Bear from November 24 through Dec. 1, off the coast of Southern California.

Involving some 10,000 men and 16 ships, the training operation centered around a fast carrier striking force subjected to air and sub-surface attack.

Opposition was provided by jet and conventional aircraft and by submarines, simulating attacks with all types of weapons. During the exercise the striking force was replenished at sea by fleet oilers, stores ships and ammunition ships.

Roger J. Cline, fireman apprentice, USN, son of Harney A. Cline of Naper, is serving aboard the anti-submarine warfare support aircraft carrier USS Bennington, a unit of the First Fleet which took part in Exercise Black Bear from November 24 through December 1, off the coast of Southern California.
