## Ainsworth Canal **Bid Opening Set**

Construction Engineer R. L. Boyce announces that bids will be opened at 10 aam. CST May 10, for construction of the second section of the Ainsworth Canal. The bids will be publicly opened and read in the conference room

at the Ainsworth Project office. The second section of the Canal is 14.3 miles long as compared to the 7.7 mile section No. 1 currently under construction. This section will also be concrete lined.

Among the requirements are 1,370,000 cubic yards of excavation, 38,000 cubic yards of concrete lining, 134,000 feet of treated bridge timber, and 2,600 tons of hay mulching. Time for completion is 950 calendar days.

Award of the contract is expected in the latter part of May and will be made by the Assistant Commissioner and Chief Engineer, Denver.


