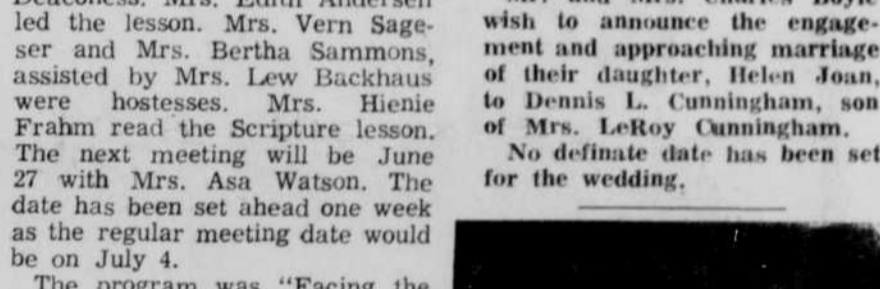

Amelia News

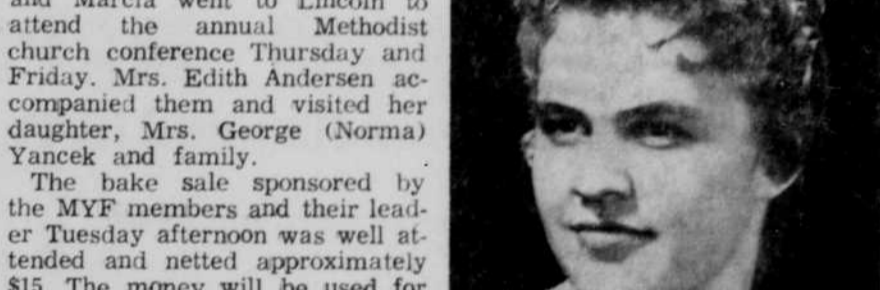
