There was a motion by Dr. Wilson, seconded by Harold Weier that a special meeting be called on Sept. 11 to pass on Bills now due. On account of other pressing business at this time it was not possible to get these bills processed in time for the regular meeting. Motion carried.

There followed a discussion with attorney Julius Cronin taking part and advising the Board regarding the matter of acquiring the property adjacent to the present athletic field.

Motion by Dr. Wilson seconded by Dr. Cook that the Board contact Dr. Kubitschek for the purpose of negotiating for the acquisition of Blocks B, C, D and E adjacent to the present athletic field, provided he can furnish a good title, and to include this business at the Special meeting to be held on 9-11-62. Motion carried.

Motion by Dr. Wilson, seconded by Harold Weier that the Board have attorney J. D. Cronin contact Jack Berigan in the matter of establishing the property line to the east, as surveyed. Motion carried.

Mr. McCoy reported that the Fire Alarm System is now receiving some attention by the contractor, but as yet the work is unfinished. It was decided that the contractor should again be notified that this work must be finished without further delay.
