
## Wild Game—Regale

Cut in half 6 medium-sized tomatoes of uniform shape. Sprinkle each with salt and pepper and a few grains of cayenne, top with bread crumbs and dot with bits of butter. Place on broiling rack. Mash finely with a fork 1 hard cooked egg. Add and mix 3 table.

spoons soft butter, \* teaspoon prepared mustard, salt, pepper, 3 drops Tabasco sauce, 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce, 1 teaspoon sugar and 2 tablespoons wine vinegar. Put the tomato halves under the flame of the broiler and broil until the crumbs brown, top each half with a spoonful of the deviled sauce.

EN CASSEROLE

Wash 2 cups wild rice in several changes of cold water and drain. Heat ½ cup olive oil or butter, stir in 2 tablespoons each chopped onion and chives, 3 tablespoons chopped green pepper. Stir the mixture into the rice and cook over a very gentle heat stirring constantly, until the rice begins to turn yellowish. Stir in 4-4% cups hot chicken broth or game stock, made with the bones and trimmings. Season to taste with salt and freshly ground pepper and lastly add % cup blanched, shredded almonds. ## ROAST WILD DUCK PROVENCALE

Soak one dozen pitted ripe olives for one hour in a little olive

Melt 4 tablespoons butter in a skillet, add one onion and 3 stalks of celery, all finely chopped, and saute them until soft. ## PHEASANT LA CHASSEUR

pheasant Salt Pepper

1 tablespoon butter 1 tablespoon olive oil 1 dozen mushrooms

green onions ounce brands

cup dry white wine fresh tomatoes, peeled cup chicken broth 1/4 cup minced parsley

Cut pheasant in serving pieces, rub the pieces with lemon juice, salt and pepper. In a heavy iron skillet put the butter and olive oil, when hot brown the pheasant until golden. Then add mushrooms, onions (including the tops), brandy, wine, tomatoes (chopped), chicken broth and parsley. Cover and cook over a gentle fire for 1/2 hour to 1 hour depending on the age of the pheasant-or until tender. Before serving, sprinkle with tarragon.
