O'Neill, Nebr. October 29, 1962 Dear Sir: In relation to our school situation, I would like to present to the voters, a bit of official data that may be of assistance in determining whether we need a

new school or consider improving our present plant. Several years ago, there was much mention made as to overall decreases in population for the past several decades and stress was placed on the small increase in population for O'Neill

In children below the age of 18 years in the county, it shows that there were in 1960 some 686 fewer children than there were 20 years before! The heaviest decrease was in the number of high school students in the 15-17 year bracket. Now someone may ask, what does the Holt County record have to do with the O'Neill situation? This is a very good question, but before we attempt to pinpoint the O'-Neill situation, we should look into what has happened in the adjacent townships that have always provided a substantial number of O'Neill students, particularly in the high school age group. The record is a bit more

Now what does the O'Neill record show? It clearly discloses that there has been an overall increase of some 351 from 1940 to 1960, but the bulk of the increase was between the years 1940 and 1950 when the record shows 190 additional students. Just what is the outlook for the school and school children? I

don't believe that the record needs much explanation nor analyzing, because we have been aware of what is happening for some time past and we didn't need the Census records to convince us. We are now and have been for the past 20 years in the middle of an outmigration of our people and the end is nowhere in sight! People are leaving our area and state in increasing numbers due to the abandonment of the small family sized farm and the lack of employment opportunity in the smaller towns. Families are leaving and the children are going with them. Holt County is down 2830 people in past 20 years and O'Neill increased but 154 between the years 1950 and 1960. While O'Neill has not felt the impact of the migration of our people, it will come about because as agriculture goes so goes O'Neill and all the other towns in our part of the state and coun-

In reverting to the school situation locally, what do we need? We need the construction of additional classrooms for the students that we now have going to school in leased quarters and we need them in a hurry. We cannot wait until another 2 years

roll around to again whip up interest in a new school, the need of which to me at least, appears to grow progressively less as time goes on. In addition to the additional space, we must upgrade the technical facilities of

our school and this should be done as soon as practicable. Closing our eyes or turning our backs on our educational requirements, is doing a very great disservice to the youngsters coming along, who in this day and age need the best education that we can provide for them. Conversely, to understate or overstate a problem knowingly or unknowingly, is to cause the problem to lose friends who might have otherwise supported such cause of action. Let us get underway with our building program with all possible speed.
