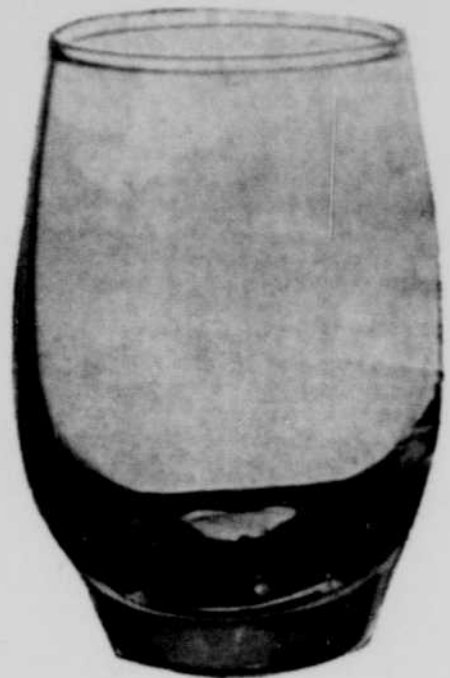
Mr. and Mrs. E. E. Clark have moved into their new home in the west part of town.

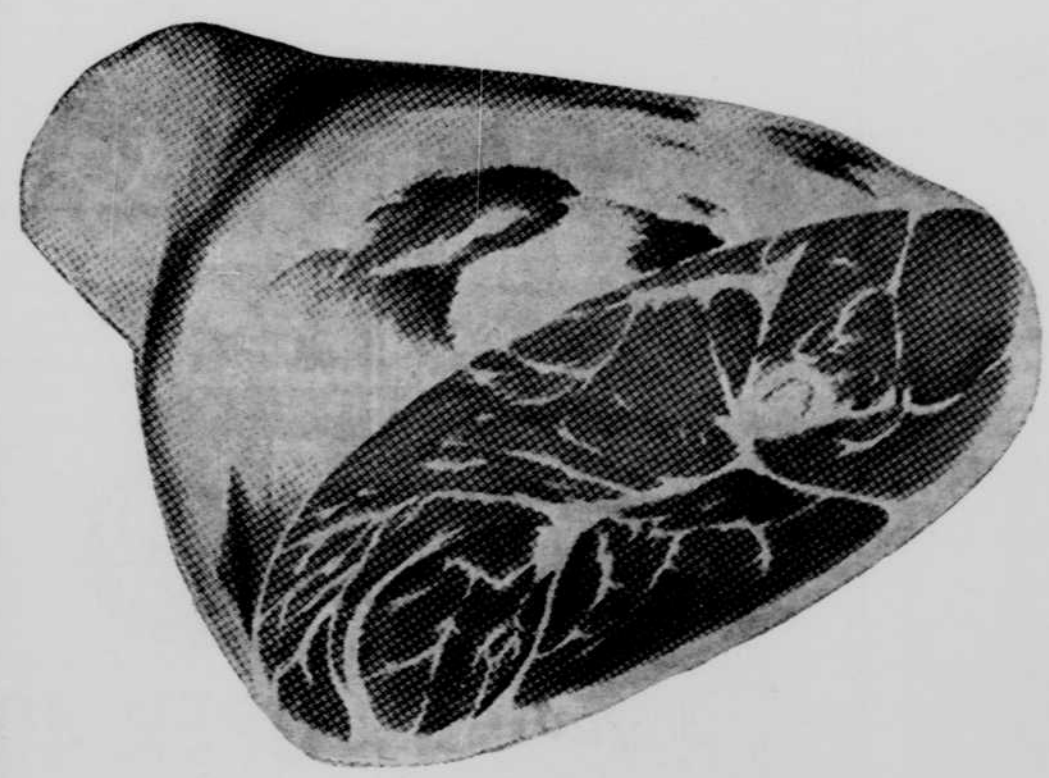
