A memorandum has been received from the State Tax Commissioner's office stating that amounts earned but not received on January 1, 1963 for the storage of resealed grain shall be subject to intangible tax as an account receivable. These amounts will be placed on the personal schedule of each individual, partnership, or corporation which has resealed grain. This is done in accordance with Section 77-201.01 R. S. Nebraska.

The tax is 25¢ on \$100 or \$2.50 on \$1,000. The penalty for failure to comply with this is five times the amount due.

The number of bushels of grain resealed will be made available to the Assessor's office by the county A.S.C.S. office.

We hope your full cooperation will be received in this matter and the Assessor's office will do their best to answer any questions you might have.
