In this first sketch Redfern gives us a very pretty yachting gown for a boate. It is of cream colored serge with a narrow line of dark blue braid at the top of the hem. The bodice and sleeves are of dark blue serge, but the cuffs are of the cream color, with three rows of blue braid. The waist is loose and has wide revers edged with braid and decorated with embroidered design. The cap is of blue and cream striped silk.



The other model is rather stylish and rather more elaborate. It is of dark blue serge with narrow lines of gold braid around the skirt and forming the front panel. Nine rows of braid, in clusters of three in the sleeves, which also have small gold buttons on the outside seam. The vest is white serge.
