The volume shall be printed and bound in four separate parts, as a quarterly, each part containing either 64 or 80 pages, at the option of the society. The quality and weight of paper, the quality of the press work, size of page, type and margins shall be the same as in volume III of the society's "Transactions and Reports" to be seen in the office of the secretary of state. The type shall be small size, and the quality of papers for covers fine. The first part shall be printed within 60 days, and the succeeding parts at intervals of not more than 60 days.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a bond in the sum of \$500.
