WASHINGTON, March 25 .- In the senate several petitions from Massachusetts and Missouri were presented, protesting against the ratification of the extra lation treaty wi h Russia. Senator Hoa. said he would once more raise the quastion of their consideration in open seasion. Several senators expressed a desire to have a full senate when the question was discussed, whereupon Senator Hoar withdrew the point of order for the time being.

The report on the Montana senatorial case was presented. Senator Hoar gave notice that he would ask the senate to consider them on Thursday next. House bill appropriating \$60,000 for a
