CITY ELECTIONS.

Scattering Returns from Several Municipal Contests.

A DEMOCRATIC DAY IN OHIO.

A Republican Elected Mayor of Hartford, Conn.—Returns from Iowa, Kansas, Indiana and North Dakota—Little Excitement and a Light Vote.

DAYTON, April 8.—Returns are late in coming in owing to the city having been restricted, in consequence of which there was only one polling place in each ward. The Democrats have elected their entire city ticket and carried eleven out of fifteen wards. J. E. P. Ward (Dem.), for mayor, has about 1,700 majority over Charles F. Coombs (Rep.). The Democrats will have an overwhelming majority in the city council and board of education, both of which have hitherto been Republican. Two wards are still out. The vote was light.

TOLEDO, April 8.—The municipal election here gives the city a Democratic council and a Republican board of aldermen, with a Republican majority of 1 on a joint ballot. Henry C. Deery, Republican candidate for police commissioner, was defeated, as was C. G. Gibson, street commissioner. Democrat James H. Brown, as trustee, was defeated. The vote was very light.

CLEVELAND, April 8.—The Democrats elected their entire city ticket, consisting of W. S. Dickson, police commissioner, Henry Dorn waterworks trustee, and O. G. H. Justice, justice of the peace, by majorities of 1,200 to 1,500. The Democrats gained 1500 in the council, but a tie in the board of managers, the city council will stand Republican, 8; Democrats, 14.

CINCINNATI, April 8.—The city election was very quiet. An unusually light vote was cast, and while there was a great deal of individual enthusiasm, there was not much political feeling. The Democratic ticket was elected with the exception of Young, tax collector, and Ed. P. H. for clerk of the police court. Ed. P. H., the present incumbent, was re-elected.

ZANESVILLE, April 8.—A light vote was cast here. The principal contest was over the waterworks board and council, both of which remain Democratic. Republicans gain one commissioner and Democrats the city clerk and street commissioner. The majorities range from 11 to 100.

CLEVELAND, April 8.—The municipal election passed off quietly. A very light vote was polled. The Democratic city ticket is elected by about 1,000 plurality, but Republicans elected twenty-two councilmen against fifteen elected by the Democrats. The board of education is still Democratic.

IOWA.

DES MOINES, Ia., April 8.—The city election for the new and enlarged city was held here. Great interest was shown in the contest being between the straight Republican and Citizens ticket, the latter headed by William Foster, a Republican, and J. P. Sawyer. There are twenty-one voting precincts, some of them several miles apart, so that the returns are very slow in coming in. But it is probable, at midnight, that the Republicans have elected their straight ticket.

INDIANAPOLIS.

LOGANSPORT, April 8.—Little interest was shown in the township election here. The entire Democratic ticket, with the exception of one officer, was elected by reduced majorities. Reports from the country show a Republican gain of three trustees out of twelve.
