REPUBLICAN RECIPROCIY.

EXPORTS IN 1890. In 1890, during the five months ending September 1, the exports of bacon from the United States to Brazil amounted in value to \$29,748.

In 1890, during the five months ending December 31, the exports of the United States to Porto Rico amounted in value to \$98,478.

In 1890, during five months ending September 1, the exports of bacon from the United States to Cuba and Porto Rico amounted in value to \$49,198.

In 1890, during the month of September, the exports of sewing machines from the United States to Cuba and Porto Rico amounted in value to \$11,571.

In 1890, the volume of wages paid to employes engaged in the meat industries in Chicago aggregated \$35,585,980.

In 1890, during the four months ending December 31, the exports of the United States to Cuba \$2,246, 193, or 40.6 per cent, was caused by the stimulating effects on trade of republican reciprocity.

In 1890, during the eleven months ending November 30, the exports of steam engines and machinery from the United States to Brazil amounted in value to \$419,567.

OUR TIN PLATE MAKERS.

No set of men have ever been more slandered and harassed than the Americans who have gone to work to develop an American tin-plate industry. Their motives are constantly maligned and their actions are continually misrepresented.

RECIPROCIY.

Restricted Reciprocity is the logical outcome of protective principles. In taking off the duty from a country's products we simply reciprocate for the remission of a duty which would otherwise operate against us.

Treaties have already been completed with five republics and nine colonies and many others are under consideration.

THE policy of free silver coinage prevails in Mexico, and the result is that gold is employed only in foreign commerce, and the domestic business of the country is all transacted with a depreciated currency.
