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ALREADY the democratic wire workers of Plattsmouth are interviewing the fellows who are reported to be disappointed over the recent republican nominations at Weeping Water, and are "stroking the hair the right way." Last fall when these same gentlemen were retailing lies by the yard, for nothing, and all wool at that, in order to induce republicans of Plattsmouth to bolt their ticket, they were, only, concerned lest Plattsmouth should be injured by reason of the election of a Weeping Water republican.

It would be almost comical should the friendly relations existing between the government of Spain and France be disturbed on account of the disorderly conduct of the Paris mob towards the Spanish king the other day. The Madrid press is a vaguely indignant over the insult towards their sovereign and rumor has it that the Spanish government will call upon the French Republic for an explanation; while president Grevy has already apologized to his excellency king Alfonso, who received the explanation hesitatingly.

The republic of France should advertise to royalty abroad that in visiting the city of fashions the government would not hold itself responsible for the politeness and breeding of the Paris hoodlums.

EVER since Dave Butler, Tobe Castor, J. Sterling Morton, Edward Rosewater and James W. Savage appointed themselves a committee upon ways and means to lariat the anti-monopoly party and lead it into democratic pastures, the beauty of the tail to the platform of that party in this state has been growing more and more apparent. The tail to Mr. Morton's patent right—states right—platform, pronounced government simply a sort of committee affair, something that meets, and performs and adjourns *sine die*. So this distinguished committee who have manipulated the anti-monopoly party of Nebraska, into the democratic corral, will adjourn as soon as the present campaign is ended. The work for which they were appointed having been disposed of, the committee will become *fructus officii*.

THE Omaha Bee says Judge Savage is a lawyer of some thirty years' practice, and that he is a good lawyer, and an honest man; hence he should receive the support—non-partisan support—of all good citizens.

The HERALD concedes the fact that Judge Savage is a good lawyer and a good man and that he has been in the practice either as lawyer or judge for some twenty-five or thirty years.

In reply to this the HERALD calls the Bee's attention to the fact that Hon. J. B. Reese is a lawyer of some twenty years' practice, of good reputation, a good lawyer, and an honest man. When the Bee says Mr. Reese is no lawyer it simply is talking about something of which it is ignorant; but the "doffy" argument the Bee uses is that Mr. Reese is not fit for a Supreme Judgeship, because he has never been a District Judge; that in addition to his being a good lawyer, before he can possibly be fit for the supreme bench, he must have served in the capacity of Judge of some District Court. We suppose from this course of reasoning the Bee would object to any of the brilliant attorneys of the Omaha bar being elevated to the bench in that district unless they had served an apprenticeship as County Judge, and for qualifications as County Judge, that sensitive organ would compel a fellow to put in a few years as an Omaha Justice of the Peace. The Omaha Bee should remember that judges and lawyers are made of the same clay, and that some mighty poor timber gets upon the bench and is promoted, while fit and suitable material oftentimes fails to be recognized.

The Bee's argument is a sort of sniveling service twaddle, which the masses will never appreciate.

It is the old stale democratic "stock in trade" argument at in Cass county and the republican party of old Cass have certainly had enough of it.

When a good man well qualified to fill an office, is named by his party, for that office, members of his party should be able to furnish some better argument for voting against him than that of locality.

### A FIERY BEAUTY.

#### The Great Astronomical Event of the Coming Year.

Local scientists are already turning their attention to the wonderful comet which is looming along through space in the general direction of the earth, but which will not reveal its gorgeousness to the naked eye for several months to come. When it does come it will stay a year or more, and will be a grand event in astronomy. Concerning the fly beauty the following taken from the *Astronomer*, which seems to have gotten in to dispute with itself on points of statistics is very interesting:

The most recent calculations made at the Dudley Observatory relative to the orbit of the new comet, result in figures quite different from those reported in our issue of Sunday last. Yet for the short period embraced by the time since discovery, the two calculations place the comet in very nearly the same apparent positions as seen from the earth. About once in fifteen or twenty years a comet comes along, which, like this, gives the computers a great deal of trouble.

It now appears probable, say the astronomers of Dudley Observatory, that the comet is from three to four times as far from both the earth and the sun as the sun is from us. This distance is almost unprecedented in discovery. In fact no case is remembered in which this distance was so great. It appears probable that the comet will not come to perihelion until about June 1 of next year, and that it will remain in telescopic view for a year or more. The plane of its orbit seems to be nearly perpendicular to that of the earth's course about the sun. The perihelion point is indicated by the calculations to be at a distance from the sun not much greater than the earth's average distance.

For at least a week or ten days to come all calculations relative to the true course of this seemingly very erratic body must be regarded as quite approximate. The slightest variation in the observed places of a body so distant as this one probably is, throws the resulting element of the orbit away off. The case might be well illustrated by the result of shooting at a mark 200 yards off with a pistol having a barrel less than an inch long—supposing it would carry so far. With a reasonably good marksman the balls would all take about the same course for the first few feet after leaving the barrel, but their subsequent course would be entirely a matter of conjecture. Yet it would be easier to hit an eight-inch ball's eye 200 yards with a pistol whose barrel is one inch long, than it now is to say from observation and calculation where the B. O. K. comet will be (within 10,000,000 miles) at the end of three months. Give us a barrel three inches long and we will give you a dead center, say the astronomers of the observatory.
