An Impending Railway War.

Ben Butler Disowned by the Democratic Fathers in Massachusetts.

Miscellaneous Notes.

A NUMBER OF CHANGES.

The following changes have been ordered in the quartermaster's department of the army: Col. J. D. Bingham, relieved from duty of the department of Missouri, and ordered to San Francisco; Major James Gillis, relieved from duty at Fortres Moore, and ordered to the department of Missouri.

PENSION AGENTS.

District Attorney Corkhill has written a letter with a view of stopping the practice of dishonest pension claim agents, and expresses the wish that all soldiers or other persons having copies or descriptive circulars from agents in this city, or knowledge of any fraudulent transactions on their part, to send him full information, to the end that each case may be put in shape by special agents for legal prosecution.

Attorney General Brewster has promised his earnest co-operation of the department of justice, and all its officers, says that many cases of fraud are heart-rending. Maimed and decrepit soldiers, widows and orphans pay their pittance to agents, who merely file their applications to enable them to collect the money from their deluded clients. If the present law is inadequate to prevent such transactions, congress should provide an efficient remedy.

If nothing else were accomplished by the investigation it would at least warn soldiers and their widows and orphans of their danger, and prevent in the future, their being swindled out of their money, and it will vindicate honest agents from unjust suspicion.

RAILROAD OFFICIALS.

Salt Lake, Oct. 26.—This evening Charles Francis Adams and other Union Pacific directors arrived in Salt Lake from Idaho, where they have been inspecting the Oregon short line. They will inspect the Salt Lake & Nevada, a branch of the Union Pacific, where they propose extending to Nevada and California at no distant day.

RAILROAD WAR.

A freight war is prevailing between the Union Pacific and Denver & Rio Grande from the Missouri river to Salt Lake. The latter road was the first to cut rates, dropping to fifty cents on all classes of freights. The Union Pacific met it and dropped to twenty-five cents a hundred. The cut will probably not last long, and merchants are making the most of it.

San Francisco, Oct 22.—A circular signed by all railroad freight managers of lines west of the Missouri river, except the Northern Pacific, has been addressed to merchants on the Pacific coast to the effect that if the present rates continue to be cut by the Northern Pacific or if that road should offer shippers rates lower than those specified in special contracts, such reduction will be promptly met by other lines, no matter how low the Northern Pacific might go.

NO EXCURSIONS.

At a meeting of local agents representing the Chicago, Atlantic & New York, Erie & Western, New York Central, Baltimore, Ohio & Pennsylvania, Michigan Central, Lake Shore & Michigan Southern roads have agreed to stop the payment of commissions of any kind of overland business over their roads. A circular was also drawn up addressed to local agents of other eastern lines, requesting them to combine organizations of excursions to their own line, as under the agreement the contracting lines would be compelled to oppose the excursions in every way.

BUTLER MUST GO.

Boston, Oct. 23.—The following address will be issued tomorrow by "old line" democrats: Without abating our opposition to the political views and methods of the republican party we believe the democratic success in the future can be neither deserved or achieved unless we free ourselves from the charge of supporting candidates who have lowered the standard of political morality. We appeal to your patriotism and sober common sense to oppose the re-election of B. F. Butler. Caring nothing for party or principles, he subordinates every public interest to his own aggrandizement, and should be again elected the democratic party of Massachusetts would be held responsible for his administrative acts and eccentricities of the past and future, while no responsibility attaches itself to us for any acts of Mr. Robinson. Such being our belief we cannot hesitate to declare that we intend to do all that may be in our power to secure

the defeat of Butler, and we urge all democrats to join with us in such an action. The Herald says that it was announced on the best, but not official authority, that S. A. B.
