HOUSE.

In the house bills were introduced and referred by Mr. Payson to restrict the ownership of real estate in territories to American citizens. It probibits any non-resident alien, who has not declared his intention to b. come a citizen of the United States from acquiring or owning, possessing or holding any real estate in any of the territories.

The bill relating to police regulations in the District of Columbia was passed after considerable discussion of the sections prohibiting the sale of lottery tickets, Mr. Rrown (Ind) characteriz ing the Louisiana State Lottery as the colossal swindle of the age. The clerks n one of the government depar ments expended \$10,000 monthly in lottery ti k. ts.
