POLITICAL NEWS.

The Great Arthur Meeting in New York City.

Cooper Union Crowded to its Fullest Capacity.

The Business Men Enthusiastic for Arthur.

New York, May 20.—The great mass meeting of citizens and business men called to express the approval of the nomination of President Arthur, and urge his renomination for a second term was held tonight at Cooper Union. A more orderly and intelligent assemblage was never before seen in this city. At promptly half-past seven

EVERY SEAT in the building was occupied; half an hour later, when Coraditus N. Bliss, of Bliss, Fabian & Co., called the meeting to order, not another person could find standing room. Throng continued to pour into the doorways until at ten minutes past 8, the commandant of police gave orders to close the doors.

AMONG THE AUDIENCE were a large number of ladies. Seats were provided on the platform for about 60 people. Among the prominent persons who occupied them, were Cornelius N. Bliss, Frederick S Winslow, Henry Ward Beecher, Benjamin H. Bristow, Edward Pierrepont, Assistant U. S. Treasurer T. C. Acton, Surrogate D. G. Rollins Dr. C. R. Agnew and others.

A band at the right of the platform discoursed popular airs. When Mr. Beecher appeared, the audience gave three cheers, and the applause continued some time after he took his seat. The Siamese minister came in just before the meeting began and with the members of his suite, were given seats on the platform.

CORNELIUS N. BLISS called the meeting to order, and briefly stated the objects for which it was called. He said it was an unusual thing for a business man to have a voice in choosing candidates for the presidency, as this was a work for those supposed to be better versed in public affairs. He would take the liberty to express his views, and urge the renomination of a man, who, although he came into the office under such trying circumstances, had

PROVED HIMSELF SO WORTHY of the great charge entrusted to him by the people, and whose administration had met with such success. [Applause.] President Arthur was certain to receive the vote of New York state, which could not be said of any other candidate. Bliss then concluded by introducing

FREDK. S. WINSLOW, president of the Mutual Life Insurance company as chairman of the meeting. Winslow was received with applause. He characterized Arthur as a man of the highest integrity, in every way worthy of support. Men of all classes were centering upon President Arthur. He denied this was a class meeting, and asserted that it was a mass meeting of all citizens. Every one felt the importance of having a good candidate in the present crisis, and he felt certain their efforts would be crowned with success in November next.

A long line of vice presidents, including the names of the most prominent business men, and resolutions in the heartiest spirit of the meeting were adopted.

Park Goodwin, editor of the Commercial Advertiser, made a short address and then

REV. HENRY WARD BEECHER was presented and again enthusiastically welcomed. He said: "A most excellent evening; paper in Brooklyn, whose editor I esteem very highly because he esteems me very highly [laughter] not long ago in a playful assault said Mr. Beecher used to be very much opposed to President Arthur but he had come around and become a great friend of his and that was like Beecher [laughter]. I am here to verify every word of that. I am therefore a witness from the other side and it is just like Mr. Beecher (and I hope it will be till his death) that when he finds himself on the wrong side to get over on the other. (Long continued applause). I am here not as a clergyman, but as a business man. I have a right to speak what I think on all questions respecting the public weal and to give forth such views as I think will conduce to the welfare of our Nation;
