New York, May 20 .- The great mass meeting of citizens and business men called to express the approval of the ministration of President Arthur and urge his renomination for a second term was held topight at Cooper Union. A more orderly and intelligent assemblage was never before seen in this city. At promptly half-past

were a large number of ladies. Seats were provided on the platform for about 60 perple. Among the prominent persons who occupied them, were Cornelius N. Bliss, Frederick S Winslow, Henry Ward Beecher, Berjamin H. Bristow, Edward Pierrepont, Assistant SHINGLES, LATH, U. S. Treasurer T. U. Acton, Surrogate D. G. Rollins Dr. C. R. Agnew and others.

A band at the right of the platform discoursed popular airs. When Mr. Beecher appeared, the audience gave iree cheers, and the applause contin-

and some time after he took his seat. The Siamese minister came in just before the meeting began and with the members of his suite, were given seats on the platform.

CORNELIUS N. BLISS

called the meeting to order, and briefly stated the objects for which it was called. He said it was an unusual thing for a business man to have a voice in choosing candidates for the presidency, as this was a work for those supposed to be better versed in public affairs. He would take the liberty to express his views, and urge the renomination of a man, who, although he came into the office under such trying circumstances, had

PROVED HIMSELF SO WORTHY of the great charge intrusted to him by the people, and whose administration had met with such success. [Applause. President Arthur was certain to receive the vote of New York state, which could not be said of any other eandidate. Bliss then concluded by intro-

FREDK. S. WINSLOW. president of the Mutual Life Insurance company as chairman of the meeting. Winslow was received with applause. He characterized Arthur as a man of the highest integrity, in every way worthy of support. Men of all classes were centering upon President Arthur. He denied this was a class meeting, and asserted that it was a mass meeting of all citizens. Every one felt the importance of having a good condidate in the present crisis, and Le felt certain their efforts would be crowned with success in November next.

A long line of vice presidents, lacluding the names of the most promincat business men, and resolutions in the heartiest spirit of the meeting were Horse, Mule & Ox Shoeing

They do not care so much about policies because they can adapt themselves to policies; but they do want to be able to look forward to a stable and uniform policy of government. A morning glory can adapt itself to circumstances, can climb up around a piece of twine, or, like a charming woman, to an ugly man, about a dry stick, [laughter] But if you are going every day to put in a new stick, it will give up bye and bye. We have niet here simply in advance to suggest to the convention at Chica go what is the will of the republicans of New York, together with as many democrats as God has made rational and intelligent.
