Work Having Already Begun in New York.

B. F. Jones Elected Chairman of the National Committee.

Opinions and Comments.

News Notes.

New York, June 26.—The republican national committee met at the Fifth Avenue hotel today, John W. Mason, of West Virginia, temporary chairman; George W. Hooker, of Vermont temporary secretary.

At a meeting of the republican national committee every state and territory were represented other by member or proxy, except Georgia, Minnesota, Texas, Montana, Washington Territory, Wyoming and Utah. Haynes of Maine, moved that a committee be appointed to nominate permanent officers. The chair named J. M. Haynes, G. A. Hobart and J. E. Morey, and the gentlemen retired.

B. F. JONES FOR CHAIRMAN.
The special committee reported B. F. Jones, of Pittsburg, for chairman, S. Fessenden, of Connecticut, secretary, and the following executive committee: J. B. Chaffee, Colorado; J. C. New, of Indiana; J. M. Mason West Virginia; J. M. Haines Maine; W. W. Crapo Mass.; E. Sanderson Mass.; S. B. Elkins New Mexico; G. A. Hobart New Jersey; G. W. Hooker Vermont; J. D. Lawson New York; H. D. Humphrey North Carolina; Frank Morris Louisiana; A. L. Congor Ohio; J. B. Sanborn Michigan; Church Howe Nebraska; Cyrus Leand, Jr., Kansas; J. R. Lynch Mississippi; J. S. Clarkson Iowa; D. J. C. ton Del., and E. H. Rollins Nem Hampshire.

MR. JONES,
the new chairman, made a modest address in accepting the honor. Referring to Blaine he said: "It is my good fortune to have known Mr. Blaine intimately for over 30 years. I have noticed his career since that time with unusual interest, and I have known anyone to be actuated by purer motives or governed by a higher standard of morals. His lofty patriotism and splendid abilities are recognized and acknowledged everywhere. He is always on the American side of every question. These virtues and these accomplishments account for his wonderful magnetism, and for his nearness to the hearts of the American people."

CHOLERA.
Toulon, June 26.—Six deaths from cholera today.
Toulon, June 26.—Eight deaths from cholera reported yesterday. The authorities are sparing no efforts to minimize the outbreak.
Marseilles, June 26.—Business is at a standstill on account of cholera here and at Toulon.

Toulon, July 26.—The exodus continues. Many persons are leaving the city.

After referring to Logan's magnificent record as a soldier and statesman, said: "The democratic party must be held to its record of free trade and tariff-for-revenue only, and that such candidates and such principles are set forth in our platform success is assured. Senator Chaffee reported on behalf of the sub-committee to select headquarters at New York city, that 252 Fifth Avenue could be secured. The report was accepted and the sub-committee to complete arrangements. The committee then adjourned subject to the call of the chairman.

The executive committee met in the same room and was in session two hours with closed doors.
SENATOR CHAFFEE
was made permanent chairman of the executive committee, and Col. H. S. Fessenden permanent secretary.
The committee delegates its full power to a sub-committee to act during the

recess, consisting of Elkins, Chaffee, and Hobart. It is understood these gentlemen will supplement the work of the chairman in the active organizing and working force of the committee. This sub-committee tonight resolved to add, under the power given by the general executive committee, the names of Conger, of Ohio, and CLARKSON OF IOWA is to have more specially the care of the committee's and the party's work in the western States. The general executive committee adjourned at 5 o'clock, subject to the call of the sub-committee.

The latter committee also had a meeting this afternoon.
THE IRON DUKE
Pittsburg, June 25.—When the selection of B. F. Jones, of this city, as chairman of the national republican committee was received with general satisfaction here. Mr. Jones is president of the Western Iron and Nail association and head of the firm of Jones & Laughlin; the second largest iron firm in the United States. His political experience has been limited, but he is a man of great executive ability and energy. He is one of the wealthiest men in the city, and about sixty years of age.

SERVED HIM RIGHT.
Madison, Wis., June 26.—A young man named Lawrence Worth, residing near Baraboo, yesterday received a coat of tar and feathers by the indignation citizens of Baraboo. The cause of this summary action on the part of the citizens was that Worth some weeks ago married a beautiful but rather demoted niece of Col. Allman. He immediately commenced to trade in her charms, and finally started down the Chicago & Northwestern road, prostituting her for gain to whomsoever was vile enough to do so. He returned yesterday to Baraboo, and was at once taken in hand and received the punishment he so richly deserved.
