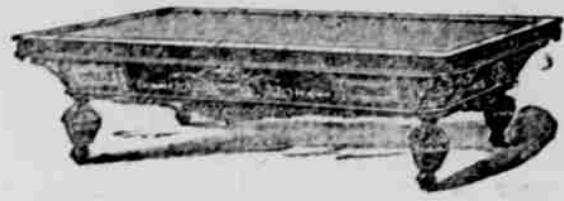


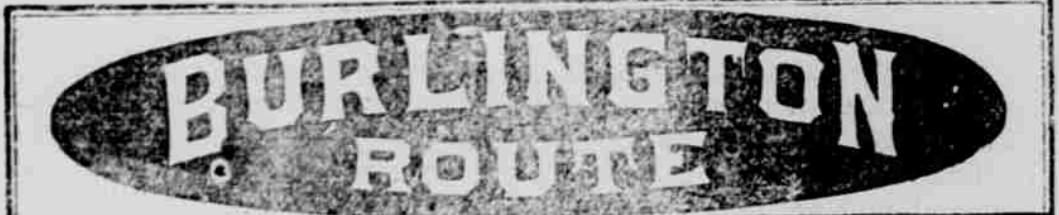

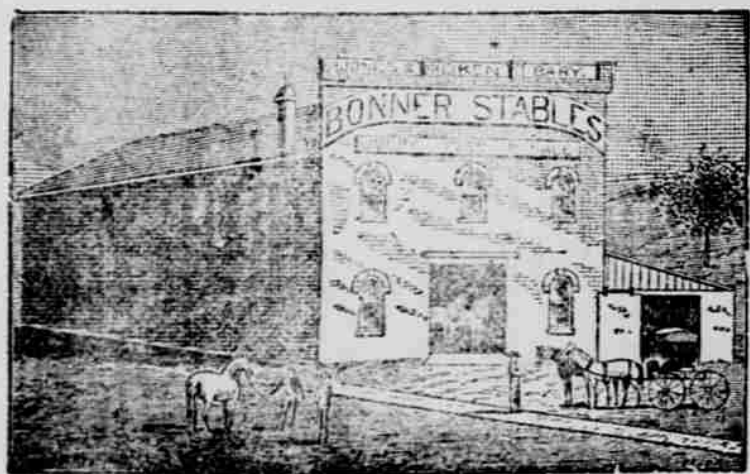

Change in Postage Rates.

By an act of congress approved June 9th, the rate of postage on newspapers and periodical publications of the second class, when sent by mail by others than publishers and newsdealers will hereafter be one cent for each four ounces or fraction thereof, to be prepaid by postage stamp affixed. The rate on such publications when so sent, has heretofore been one cent for each two ounces. Books, catalogues, engravings, maps, cards, hand bills and similar articles of "printed matter" remain in the "third class" and must be paid for at the rate of one cent for each two ounces or fraction thereof, as heretofore.
