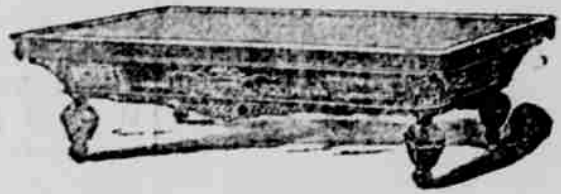
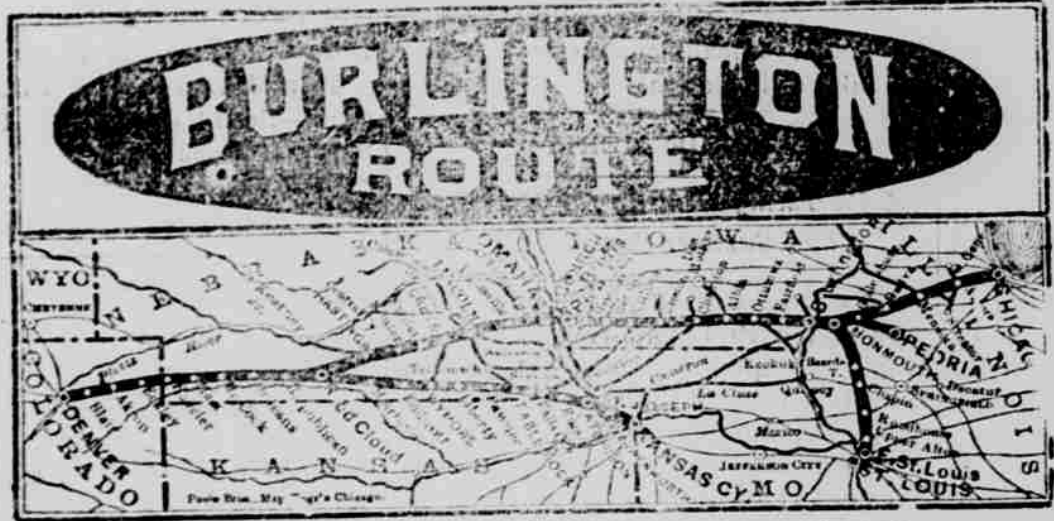

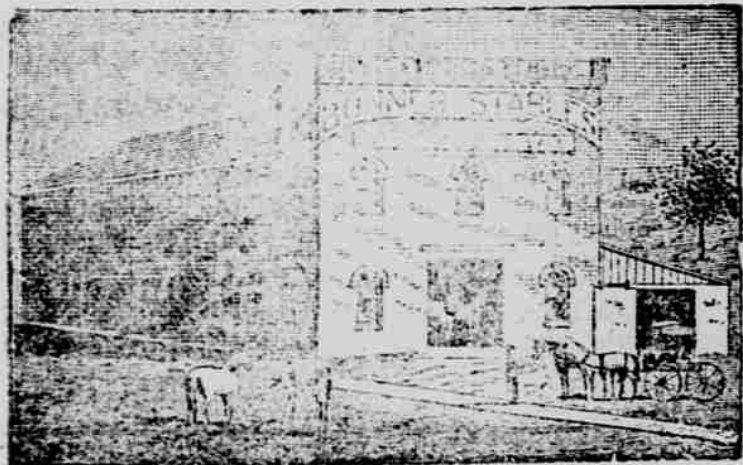

Chicago elevators contained last Saturday evening 4,248,786 bushels of wheat, 2,077,042 bushels of corn, 701,789 bushels of oats, 60,481 bushels of rye, and 83,991 bushels of barley. Total, 7,192,080 bushels now on hand of all kinds of grain, against 9,391,782 bushels a year ago. During last week the stock increased 139,213 bushels, including a decrease of 292,811 bushels of wheat and an increase of 18,364 bushels of corn. For the same date the amount of the Secretary of the Chicago Board of Trade states the visible supply of grain in the United States and Canada as 14,418,922 bushels of wheat, 3,197,723 bushels of corn, 3,107,056 bushels of oats, 471,942 bushels of rye, and 295,184 bushels of barley. These figures are less than those of a week ago by 1,019,908 in wheat and 307,607 in corn.
