## Important Supreme Court Deci- sions.

In the supreme court two important  
cases have been reversed which were  
taken up from this county. One of  
them being the Richmond rape case  
and the other the case of Burnett vs.  
The B & M. R. R. The reversal of  
these cases gives each of them new  
trials and probably the Richmond case  
a change of venue. The opinions were  
given by Judge Maxwell and we ap-  
pend them below:

Richmond vs. State. Error from  
Cass county. Reversed. Opinion by  
Maxwell, J.

In the trial upon an indictment for  
rape and assault with intent to com-  
mit rape, the trial coming on a few weeks  
after the charge was made, the accused  
filed affidavits of leading citizens show-  
ing a strong bias and prejudice against  
him, so that a fair trial could not be  
had in that county, and the affidavits  
died on behalf the state did not deny  
these statements in clear and direct lan-  
guage. Held, that a change of venue  
should have been granted.

Burnett vs. B & M. R. R. Co. Er-  
ror from Cass county. Reversed. Opin-  
ion by Maxwell, J.

1. An employee of a railroad com-  
pany is incompetent to sit as a juror in a  
case where the company is a party.  
2. If a challenge to an incompetent  
juror is overruled and he is afterwards  
peremptorily challenged and excluded  
and the record fails to show that the  
party exhausted his peremptory chal-  
lenges, the error in overruling the chal-  
lenge for cause will be without pre-  
judice. Palmer vs. People, 4 Neb. 63;  
Freeman vs. People, 4 Denio, 10.

3. A boy between ten and eleven  
years of age, while walking on a rail-  
road at a point where there was no  
thoroughfare, by accident stepped be-  
tween the guard and main rail at a  
switch, and was unable to extricate his  
foot and a switch engine being turned  
on to that line, ran over and crushed  
his foot. Held, that if the employee  
of the company, after becoming aware  
of the perilous condition of the plain-  
tiff, by the exercise of a reasonable de-  
gree of care could have prevented the  
injury, the company was liable.

## PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, a joint resolution was adopted by  
the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, at  
the Eighteenth Session thereof, and approved  
February 27th, A. D. 1883, proposing an  
Amendment to Section Four (4), of Article  
III, of the Constitution of said State, and  
that said section as amended shall read  
as follows, to-wit:

"Section 4.—The term of office of members  
of the Legislature shall be two years, and they  
shall each receive a salary of three hundred  
dollars for their services during said term, and  
ten cents for every mile they shall travel in  
going and returning from the place of meeting  
of the Legislature, on the most usual route.  
Provided, however, that neither members of the  
Legislature nor employees shall receive any  
pay or perquisites other than their salary and  
mileage. Each session, except special sessions,  
shall not last more than sixty days. After the  
expiration of forty days of the session no bill  
or joint resolutions of the nature of bills shall  
be introduced unless the Governor shall, by  
special message, call the attention of the Leg-  
islature to the necessity of passing a law on the  
subject matter embraced in the message, and  
the introduction of bills shall be restricted  
thereto."

The ballots at the election at which said  
Amendment shall be submitted shall be in the  
following form: "For proposed Amendment  
to the Constitution relating to Legislative De-  
partment." "Against proposed Amendment  
to the Constitution relating to Leg-islative  
Department."

WHEREAS, A joint resolution was adopted  
by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska at  
the Eighteenth session thereof, and approved  
February 27th, A. D. 1883, proposing an am-  
endment to Section One (1) of Article Five (5)  
of the constitution of said State, and that said  
section as amended shall read as follows, to-  
wit:

"Section 1.—The Executive Department  
shall consist of a Governor, Lieutenant Govern-  
or, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Ac-  
counts, Treasurer, Superintendent of Public  
Instruction, Attorney General, Commissioner  
of Public Lands and Buildings, and Board of  
Railway Commissioners. The officers named in  
this section shall each hold his office for the  
term of two years from the first Thursday after  
the first Tuesday in January next after his  
election and until his successor is elected and  
qualified. Provided, however, that the first  
election of said officers shall be held on the first  
Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in No-  
vember, 1884, and each succeeding election  
shall be held at the same relative time in each  
even year thereafter. All other officers that  
may be provided for by law under the provi-  
sions of this section, shall be chosen in such  
manner and at such times, and shall hold their  
offices for such length of time as may be pro-  
vided by law, and shall perform such duties  
and receive such compensation as may be pro-  
vided for by law. The Governor, Secretary of  
State, Auditor of Public Accounts, Treasurer,  
Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings,  
and Attorney General, shall reside at the seat  
of government during their terms of office, and  
keep the public records, books and papers  
such duties as may be required by law."  
The ballots at the election at which such  
Amendment shall be submitted shall be in the  
following form: "For proposed Amendment  
to Section One (1) of Article Five (5) of the  
Constitution, entitled, 'Executive Depart-  
ment.'" "Against proposed Amendment to  
Section One (1) of Article Five (5) of the Con-  
stitution, entitled, 'Executive Depart-ment.'" "An Act to provide the manner  
of proposing Amendments to the Constitu-  
tion and submitting the same to the Electors  
of this State," approved February 14th, A. D.  
1877, that said proposed Amendments shall be  
submitted to the qualified voters of this State  
for ratification or rejection at the General  
Election to be held on the 14th day of Novem-  
ber, A. D. 1884.
