The last legislature was emphatically instructed by the people to give them a law of this nature; that instruction was disregarded, caused, by the dozen or more antimonoply cranks and shysters who by some inscrutable dispensation of Providence. were permitted to occupy, seats in elther house, and very largely by the persistent and blind opposition of the railroads of the State, who, at that sension, their secret agents and lobby. Again such an instruction has been given by the people; there is scarcely a county L. C. Erven is selling goods at panic in the State where the members elect have not, in order to secure their elec-

tion, pledged their constituents a railroad law. This demand of the people may be wise, or it may be foolish; yet, such is public sentiment today, and the HERALD insists upon the present legislature bowing to this sentiment, and going at the matter, at an early, and in a straightforward, honest manner, giving the people a law of this kind. Most of the North western States, today, have coneted such laws, and we notice they do not repeal them. 
