LIFE IN AUSTRALIA.

HOW SHEEP FARMING IS CONDUCTED ON A LARGE SCALE.

Pastoral Leases Granted by the Government—The Solitary Life of a Shepherd. A Busy Time at the Station—Breeds of Sheep.

The Australian sheep farmer on a large scale usually rents a tract of several square miles from the government, at a rate calculated according to the number of sheep the land is capable of "carrying." He is called a "squatter," because in early days he simply took up, or squatted on, any unoccupied land.

The great danger to which the squatter is exposed is drought. There is a great want of rivers and perennial streams, an unusually dry season or two may reduce a man from affluence to poverty.

In New South Wales pastoral leases are granted for twenty years at a rental of 20 cents per head on the average number of cattle, and of 4 cents on the average number of sheep. At the end of the term, the land reverts with all improvements to the crown.

It is the life of a shepherd in sole charge of a flock of many head, become much more of the freedom and healthy nature of the world, and would be most unwilling to exchange it for any other. The best time on a sheep station is clearing time, for on a large run 50,000 sheep may have to be shorn. The sheep are washed a few days before they are shorn, in order that their fleeces may be dry and the "yell" may have time to rise.

As soon as the fleeces of the sheep is pushed out at a trapdoor and examined by the manager, to see whether it has been cut or badly shorn. The fleeces are taken out by boys into the wool-sorting shed, where they are rolled up and labeled according to the quality and kind of wool.
