REPUBLICAN STATE CONVENTION. The republican electors of the state of Nebraska are requested to send delegates from their several counties to meet in convention at the city of Lincoln Thursday, August 23, 1888, at 2 o'clock p. m.

GOVERNOR. Lieutenant Governor. Secretary of State. Auditor of Public Accounts. Attorney General. Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings.
