Grand Island Republicans Join the Campaign Enthusiasts.

GRAND ISLAND, Neb., Oct. 18.—An enthusiastic meeting was held here tonight. Burtinck's opera house was packed at 8 o'clock and when Hon. G. W. E. Dorsey, Captain Hill, Captain Hayes and C. O. Wheldon marched down the aisle a cheer went up that fully demonstrated the feeling in Hill county. Mr. Dorsey was first introduced to the audience and in his pointed way discussed the tariff question for an hour. He was followed by Captain Hayes, C. O. Wheldon and Captain Hill. Thomas Robinson, a mechanic, made a speech, and speaking as he did from experience with the wages of England, his talk was very telling.

Celestials Allowed to Land.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—A telegram received at the treasury department from the collector at San Francisco announces the arrival at that port of the American steamer Bertha with ninety Chinese laborers. The steamer is to be chartered at Kodiak Island, Alaska, whither they went from San Francisco. The collector asks for a ruling whether the Chinese should be allowed to land. In reply Assistant Secretary Maynard says that these Chinamen may be regarded as never having left the United States, and may therefore be permitted to land. He advises, however, that strict proof of this be demanded.

Breeding Buffalo.

TORONTO, Kan., Oct. 19.—C. S. Jones closed a contract here yesterday with parties in Manitoba for the only herd of domestic buffalo in the world of any note outside of his herd here. They were bought by parties in Pennsylvania and will be brought to Garden city next month and placed with Mr. Jones' herd. There are six three-quarter and eight half-heads, and when added to Mr. Jones' herd will make 150 head. The half and

three-quarter buffalo is a new race of cattle, and Mr. Jones says that they will surpass the world and be the coming animal for robes and meat, as they require no shelter or food except the native range. Mr. Jones has completed the organization of a stock company with a capital of \$200,000, which will establish an extensive ranch in Platte county for propagation of the buffalo.

THE BANANA BUSINESS.

Preparing the Soil—Putting Out the "Stickers"—Dredging the Canal.
Mr. Kennedy took me in charge early, and on the wharf on the shady side of the shed gave me the account of the banana business that I shall try to reproduce. I cannot do better than imagine that the reader is about to settle in Jamaica to engage in raising bananas, and that I am telling him what I have learned about the industry. The land used is likely to be either an unimproved estate, or what is known in Jamaica as "primate," that is, land that has not been improved. It is likely to be covered with all kinds of small trees. The first step is to head the land out of excess moisture, but the expense of clearing it is so much greater than it is doubtful whether profitable land is not cheaper in the end.
