TALKING 800 MILES.

SUCCESSFUL TEST OF TELEPHONING FROM BUFFALO TO BOSTON AND NEW YORK. The Buffalo Evening News reports that the new long distance telephone, which is soon to be put in operation there was tested by the officers and directors of the Bell Telephone Company on the 14th inst. The connections had been put in at 5 p. m. and communication was at once opened between Boston, Springfield, New York, Troy and Buffalo. The wires worked well, and conversation between the most distant points could be easily carried on as if both parties were within a block or two of each other in the city. The line belongs to the American Telephone and Telegraph Company of New York, and is 800 miles in length, going through Troy down to New York thence to Boston via Springfield, Mass. This test shows that the problem of long distance telephoning has been solved and all interested were congratulated on its success.

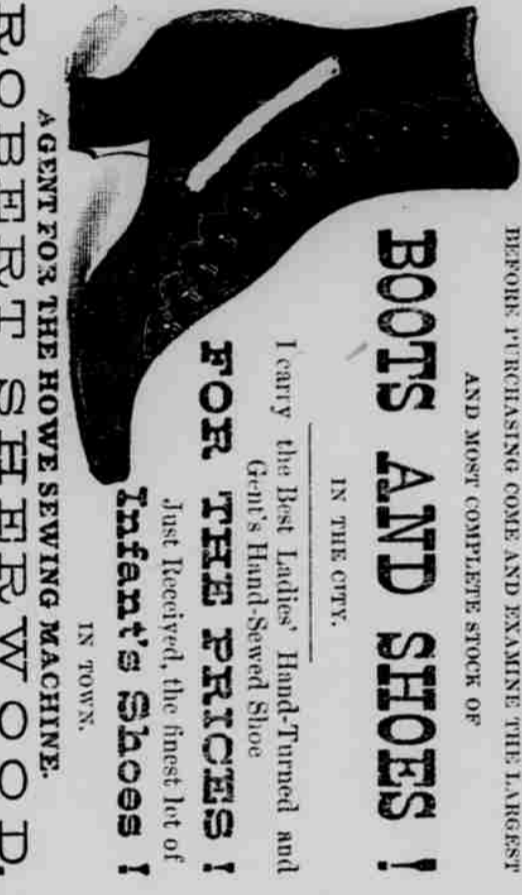
