An Ordinance

Levying a special tax and assessing the same on lots within paying district No. 1, in the city of Plattsmouth, to cover the cost of paving and curbing Main street, between the east side of Seventh street and west side of Second street in said city.

Whereas, it has been, and being hereby adjudged, determined and established that the several lots hereinafter referred to have each been specially benefited to the full amount herein levied and assessed against each of said lots respectively, by reason of the paving and curbing of that part of Main street between the east side of Seventh street and the west side of Second street.

Therefore, for the purpose of paying the cost of said paving and curbing

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Plattsmouth

SECTION 1. That the cost of paving and curbing that part of Main street within paying district No. 1, in the city of Plattsmouth, from the east side of Seventh street to the west side of Second street, said cost being the sum of \$22,481.62, be and the same is hereby levied and assessed in proportion to the feet front along said paving and curbing and according to special benefits by reason of said paving and curbing upon the following described lots; said cost being so levied on said lots respectively, as follows, to-wit:
