### WAGES AND PROTECTION.

The reduction of wages by the Brooks Iron company, the Reading Iron work and the Pottsville Iron and Steel company is another illustration of the "beauties of protection." It cuts off from 7 to 15 per cent. of the wages of 2,000 or 3,000 workmen in industries which are the special pets of framers of high tariffs. And so the "campaign of education" proceeds.—New York World.

No protectionist claims that protection maintains wages at a given standard. A dull condition of trade in any line of employment generally results in lower wages or fewer hours of work. The true test of what protection does for wages is the comparison between the wages paid in this country and those paid in Europe or Asia. Take, for instance, the wages in iron and steel manufacturing in England and the United States and it will be readily seen that the wages in this country will stand a very large reduction and yet not reach the low standard of England. Here are the figures:

tection of wage workers, forgetting that her scale was largely influenced by the highest kind of protection, rigorously enforced, until she believed her wealth, her machinery and her skilled workmen could control the markets of the world, but neither her her manufacturers nor her laborers today participate in this admiration of her fiscal policy.—American Economist.

EASTERN merchants are taking steps to bring prominently before the attention of the government the need of a line of steamers between New York and the leading South American ports. At present goods are shipped via London or Hamburg, and the American manufacturers and dealers are severely handicapped. It would only require a small subsidy to establish the line desired, and so large a trade could be worked up that it would soon become self-supporting and profitable.
