THE war department is about to issue an order that will be received with ac claim by the soldiers everywhere. It is to the effect that hereafter the weekly inspections shall be made on Saturday afternoon instead of on Sunday morning. Inspection day is the hardest in the weeto the rank and file of the army, anespecially to the "file." There is to earthly reason why the soldiers should be deprived of the Sabbath rest.

Tax ten delegates nominated by the president to represent the United State at the International Conference to b. held at Washington this fall will have pienty of interesting and important work to do. The nations represented will be the United States, Mexico, the Central and South American Republics, Hayri, San Domingo and Brazil. Th conference was suggested by Mr. Blaine is 1881, and the business to be transacted includes the practical discussion of sev eral matters of more than usual import arce. Prominent among the subjectwill be proposals for the establishment of international arbitration, uniform coinage, weights and measures, customs and tariffs, and plans for the more frequent and convenient interchange of commerce. The programme is of almost alarming proportions, but if only a small percentage of the suggestions bear fruit the convention will not have met n vain.-Globe-Democrat.

THE PROGRESS OF THE SOUTH

A few years ago the South bought of others all its hardware and agricultural implements. Now it realizes its wealth of coal and iron, and in three years has started 76 iron furraces, 52 implement factories, and about 300 machine shops and foundries. Twenty thousand miles of railroad have been built in the Southrn states since 1880, and more than \$700,000,000 expended in building new roads and improving old ones. There are now in those states more than 300 cotton mills using 1,800,000 spindles. igainst 180 mills and 700,000 spindles in 1880. The value of cotton goods made here in 1888 was nearly \$50,000,000. as gainst \$21,000,000 in 1880. The value f the agricultural products of the South a 1938 was \$800,000,000, against \$570. 100,000 in 1880. In 1880 the amount of grain raised in that section was 430,000. 00 bushels, and in 1888 it was 626,000,-100 bushels. More than a score of car nd locomotive works in the South are now supplying rolling stock for the 20,000 miles of railroad built since 1880; 300 canning factories have been opened in three years to use up Southern fruit; and glass, bricks, furniture, vehicles and host of other articles are now being made at home out of the South's own raw materials. This is solid prosperity. This is substantial progress. This is aising the South from the dependent condition of a purely agricultural section to the independent manhood of a symnetrically developed people. It carries some demands with home products, and nsures for home products a profitable nome demand .- American Economist.
